Thanks to your generosity, **all** the mission **GRANTS** for the 2014-16 biennium have been funded. That's potable water for a Lutheran school in Liberia, scholarships for St. John's Lutheran School in Delaware, books for Bethania Kids Ministries in India, to name a few, a total of \$17,500 in Mites. District LCEF funds have been used to pay the final two grants to LINC-Baltimore and to the Lutheran Church Mission of Uganda, allowing youths to focus on faith formation at the first Youth Convention held in Uganda.

## from our JUNIOR PASTORAL COUNSELOR

I was once told by a teenager that I was, "very understanding." This remark came after she lamented that her parents wouldn't listen to her and limited her options and decision making. I pointed out to the teenager that I am a parent, too and while I can be fair and objective when discussing things with her I'm not with my daughter. I am emotionally and spiritually invested in her choices and therefore, like all parents, I am very protective and subjective.

This conversation came to mind because I was thinking of the everlasting struggle to involve young women in our LWML societies. Maybe part of the struggle is that the long-time members are so emotionally and spiritually invested in the LWML that young women perceive parental guardianship rather than the welcoming all society members actually are.

It is extremely difficult to be as open as we should be when something or someone is very valuable to us and we are fully invested in her or it succeeding. Perhaps the next time your society attempts to reach out to young women in your congregation, remember the loving compromises parents, guardians and grandparents all must make with their loved ones. This compromise may be exactly what will encourage the young women to sense a real welcome where they can participate on equal footing. After all, no one really wants to relive the emotional battles she experienced with her parents as a teenager!

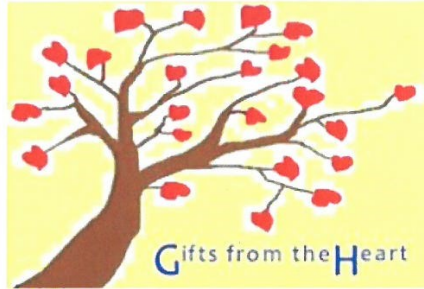
