

"Thank You" to all who returned the self-addressed envelopes with contact information for Mites and Quarterlies.

The August Mite reminder notice has been mailed to the address that we have on file. This is a 5" X 7" postcard with the LWML logo on it. It provides more space to designate where funds should be allocated, as well as a way to include a contact name and email address. The email address allows me to acknowledge that your donation has been received. If you do not have an email address, please include your cell phone number if available and you will receive a text message confirming receipt of payment. I have created an email address for responding to Mite donations received and for questions about Mites (*please see below*). If your church did not receive a notice, please contact me.

The Mite notice is mailed to each Chesapeake District Church's LWML contact person four times a year - February, May, August and November. During the second year of the biennium, a letter is sent to each church Mite contact person, which states the amounts contributed to Mites and Quarterlies during that biennium. This year the letters also provided a blue card to update contact information for each church. My appreciation to all the churches that provided that.

Thank you to all who have submitted funds since July 2018. The Chesapeake District LWML has done an amazing job. Mites have been received from **66** churches and **six** Zones. *Quarterly* donations have been received from **20** churches. *Reminder*: effective with the Spring 2020 issue, the price of the *Quarterly* increased for the first time in nine years due to paper and postage costs. The new rates are 1-9 copies at \$7.50 each and 10 or more copies at \$6 each. LWML leaders should verify if your church has submitted 2020 *Quarterly* donations.

Finally, I would like to thank each person for your words of encouragement when sending your donations. Please keep them coming! All monetary donations should be made payable to the *Chesapeake District LWML* with a memo designating where funds are to be assigned. "Ach, Mama"

I rarely got to see my grandparents in Wisconsin, as my military father and his assignments overseas, kept us on the move. As I got older, things always seemed different when we returned to Wisconsin to see my grandparents, but there were a few things I could always count on. At the end of the day, my Grandpa read aloud *Portals of Prayers*, and closed with Martin Luther's evening prayer every night. My grandparents would always have discussions with each other and my grandma would worry aloud about everything and anything. Grandpa would calmly listen while smoking his pipe, and then reply, "Ach, Mama it will be okay, it is the same just different." When my grandparents were in their 70's my grandmother worried aloud that she was afraid....70's was when people got cancer, strokes and all other kinds of ailments. Grandpa replied, "Ach, Mama, we will be okay, we will be different, but the same with each other." My brother once asked at dinner whether the cherry pie was the same as the apple pie, to which my grandfather replied...."Ach, it's the same, just little different."

In the mail I received a wonderful note from Marian Dawgert from Fredericksburg, VA, thanking me for the LWML devotion I mailed, "Bloom & Grow." Her LWML group held a LWML luncheon and used that devotion. The women wore masks, sat 6 feet apart, and brought their own bag lunches. The 20 women enjoyed fellowship and being together in His Word. When I read Marian's card, I immediately thought of my grandfather's words "Ach, Mama, it's the same but different."

Our Chesapeake District Convention will also be an "Ach, Mama!" We won't be all together in one convention room, but we will be together -Virtually! We won't be spending the night and breaking bread together, but we will be together Virtually, in His Spirit! We will all be fruits of the Spirit, baked differently with different fruits, but we will all be the same in Christ.

Our God is still the One Triune God; He is our Heavenly Father, who loves us, and will never, never leave us. "It is the Lord who goes before you. He will be with you; He will not leave you or forsake you. Deuteronomy 31:8

PHILADELPHIA — The American Bible Society has released its 10th annual "State of the Bible" report, which analyzes the Bible reading practices of Americans and their views about Scripture. This year's survey found that only 9% of respondents read their Bible on a daily basis, the lowest figure in the decade that the research has been conducted.*

This is the opening paragraph from an article titled, "2020 'State of the Bible' Report Finds Few Americans Read Bible Daily." This article came to my attention this past week, and I was intrigued and continued to read. A few paragraphs into the article, there was a bit of an explanation as to their claim: When asked how often the participant personally reads the Bible on their own — that is, when not attending church services — only 9% said that they read it every day, the lowest figure in the 10 years that the American Bible Society has been conducting the survey.

Toward the end of the article, there was an interesting bit of analysis: Researchers again asked about Bible usage from another pool of Americans in June — to see if the pandemic had affected the nation's practices — and found a 2% decrease in Bible usage. The American Bible Society also found that those who more regularly read their Bibles were more likely to turn to the Scriptures and prayer for comfort during the pandemic, while those who already spent less time in the Word turned to food, television or prescription drugs.

I am confident that a large percentage of us would fall into the 9% group who reads the Bible (in some way)

I pray that the comfort and peace that God's Word gives has been a lamp to your feet and a light for your path (Psalm 119:105) during this time of the pandemic.

So, as we continue to live in these uncertain times, give yourselves fully to what is certain—to the Lord and His Word. We know that "Jesus Christ is the same yesterday and today and forever" (Hebrews 13:8) and that "the Word of our God will stand forever" (Isaiah 40:8). As we read the Bible and daily devote ourselves to him, we agree with the apostle Paul and live out his encouragement: "Let the word of Christ dwell in you richly (Colossians 3:16).

Summary of Proposed Bylaws Changes 2020

The full text of all of the proposed bylaws amendments will be available on the website and sent to delegates in the coming weeks, but for your information, here is a summary of the major changes to be made if approved by our delegates:

- In order to align with national LWML, the terms "society" or "societies" will be changed to "group" or "groups." This does **not** mean that any women's groups in your congregations who meet under the LWML umbrella need to change names; in fact it is designed to allow for a variety of names, such as circle or guild, which can be referred to generally as a "group."
- The Vice President of Mission Outreach and Grants will be renamed Vice President of Gospel Outreach to align with national LWML.
- At the end of their current terms of office in 2022, we will be retiring the positions of Zone Liaison and Vice President of Human Care, and adding the Vice President of Special Focus Ministries along with the connected department. The Special Focus Ministries Department will contain Heart to Heart Sisters, Young Women Representatives and Deaf Ministry Liaison.
- The position of Corresponding Secretary will be retired effective at the **2020** convention. The Communications Department will then be in charge of keeping track of Quarterlies orders. The M & M Store will keep a supply of Mite Boxes and will bring them to Board Meetings, Executive Committee meetings, Retreats and Conventions.
- Duties were added or reassigned to numerous departments to be in step with national LWML.
- We were also asked by national LWML to add an amendment stating in the event of pandemic, war, or national disaster we could run a convention virtually.

Some other minor editing and process changes were also made and can be reviewed in the full document.





Suggested Gifts:
