Praise God from whom all blessings flow! By now I hope you've all heard the good news that the 2019-2021 LWML mite goal not only was met, but exceeded! The mites collected for the biennium totaled \$2,204,724.55 more than \$104.724.55 above our goal. All 21 mission grants were funded before the end of the biennium, thanks be to God!

It's hard to believe that the LWML convention in Lexington, KY is a memory now! What an exciting time we had hearing such inspirational speakers and selecting 28 mission grants for the new biennium. What a faith-filled event! For the opening worship service, there were 61 clergy in the procession and 60 helping with communion distribution, including our Jr. Pastor Counselor Gary Pomrenke. There were 82 total flags for the flag procession, including six new countries (Cambodia, Cameroon, Macau, Malawi, Rwanda and Zambia). It was an awesome sight! What is Heart to Heart Training? - Andrea Morton

I was blessed to attend the 39th Biennial LWML Convention in Kentucky and to participate in the Heart to Heart (H2H) District Leader Training. It was a wonderful experience to be able to see and talk to people in person! What a joy it was to see people's faces and smiles. We take for granted the simplest things that are so important and were reminded of how much we miss them during the lockdowns and restrictions that took place in 2020. The LWML Convention was a celebration of brothers and sisters in Christ proclaiming God's truth and sharing Jesus' love with each other, some attending convention for the first time, including me.

Our District President Teresa Tester reached out to me during our zone meeting earlier this year and asked if I'd be interested in participating in the H2H District Leader Training program that took place prior and during the convention. The program is promoted by the LWML to motivate, equip, challenge, and provide mentoring opportunities within the LWML for women of diverse ethnic groups to serve the church, participate in LWML,

witness to the world, and grow in relationships. After receiving the information and applying to attend the training, I was very happy to learn that the LWML recognizes there are gifted multicultural women serving with joy and passion in many multicultural ministries throughout the LCMS and that it is committed to assisting LWML Districts in establishing H2H Sisters programs so multicultural women may mutually encourage one another, support each other, and work together, living out the beautiful diversity that is the body of Christ. It is a blessing that the H2H Sisters District Program is an intentional effort to welcome and encourage multicultural women to participate in the life and work of the LWML.

The training exceeded my expectations. It was an intense program that taught us ways to connect and engage LCMS women of different ethnic backgrounds, respecting cultural differences and focused on listening and learning how to grow relationships and make them feel welcome at our local and District LWML events and activities.

Our group of 14 attendees from different districts grew close and we did many of the convention activities together. There are many highlights and wonderful memories of the convention for all of us who attended the program, one of them being carrying the flag of a country where the LWML has given mission grants to spread the Gospel of Christ and help local initiatives. I'm originally from Brazil and carried the Brazilian flag in the flag procession of 84 flags/countries. My family was very blessed by LWML and LCMS initiatives that created and supported our sister Lutheran church in Brazil. What a beautiful event that was and I'm very thankful to have participated in it.

Her first singles released this year have garnered featured plays on radio and digital platforms in the United States and abroad. She currently leads worship at Christian Fellowship Church in Northern Virginia. She is married to Walter, her biggest supporter and they have three beautiful daughters, Jessica, Gioia and Sofia.
