The comment by that volunteer hurt; however, my Dad needed to get to the hospital immediately. Now think about Ward 7 of Washington D.C. where Peace Lutheran is located. Think about children who are abused, bullied, poor, ill, and....? In situations at school and home, when stressed, they wet themselves. Not all in Ward 7 have access to a washing machine, clean clothes, or even soap, and must come to school soiled and smelly. This leads to more embarrassment, more harassment and more denigration of one's worth. Women of Peace, Denitra Hawkins, Yvonne Brown, Kathleen Mobley, Etta Watts as well as Rev. Lloyd Gaines have recognized the children's inescapable plight and have acted to relieve their suffering. This Mission Grant will help CHOT to provide clean underwear, other essential clothing and soap. It also provides opportunities for the women of Peace to reach out to parents, teachers and most important, to the children with the Light of Christ.

Mission Grant Focus: Grant #5 Changing Hearts One at a Time (CHOT)

Grant #5 for this biennium is Changing Hearts One at a Time (CHOT) at Peace Lutheran Church in Washington, D.C. The \$4000 they have been awarded will allow them to increase their support for children from low income families in their community. Four times each year they seek to provide children ages 1–12 years of age with basic clothing and other necessities. While providing children with the basic necessities including pajamas, clothing, coats, socks and hygiene supplies, they also share the Gospel. The members seek to build relationships with children and their families, and show them why the Bible is relevant to their future and their faith. Changing Hearts provides outreach to children in the church community. Many of the children attend Houston Elementary School. In the spirit of Matthew 5:16 “In the same way, let your light shine before others, that they may see your good deeds and glorify your father in heaven.” Four times a year the members plan and execute the supply distribution. Participating members shop, package and distribute the items. At the April 2022 distribution over 200 bags were provided. The focus was on undergarments based on anecdotal information provided by the Assistant Principal. Additionally, 50 sets of undergarments (25 boys and 25 girls) were provided to the schools for emergency use. A generous donor also provided t-shirts from the Washington Nationals 2019 World series victory that the members of CHOT were able to give to the parents present. As the bags were distributed at dismissal of school, volunteers from the church were able to share with the children that God knows their heart and their prayer that the small gift would help them to let their light shine with a smile.



CHOT has a core group of 15 volunteers, supplementary support is provided by some of the seniors and sick & shut-in members who stuffed bags at home. On average volunteers gave a minimum of 12 hours each. Initial funding for CHOT was provided as a part of the church outreach budget and a \$250 grant from Thrivent. The funding from LWML will allow the expansion of the program to include more children and their families. CHOT volunteers report that they were touched by the many hugs and smiles they received from children and parents. The families were in awe with the gift bags and very thankful. Members of CHOT change the items given each cycle based on the needs of the children. Donations are scheduled for April, July, October and December. Changing Hearts One at a Time allows the members of Peace Lutheran Church to be a light to the children and families of their community.



Hope Lutheran LWML displays this quilt, circa 1996, annually through the month of October in recognition of the Lutheran Women in Mission organization.

A patchwork of material, precisely cut, fine and smooth, held together with thread so delicate and detailed the stitches often cannot be seen without a magnifying glass. This describes the Hope Lutheran LWML quilt as well as the designer of the quilt. Marie Nelson served the Lord with joy and gladness throughout her life. She quietly helped the needy, mentored and inspired the young women in Hope's congregation and championed the mission of LWML. Marie, a founding member of Hope Lutheran Church, Virginia Beach, Virginia, and of the Hope LWML group, followed the quilt pattern from the book *Biblical Blocks* by Rosemary Makhan, published by Martingale & Company to design this quilt. She mindfully selected the colors, border, binding and finishing which all serve to represent LWML. The women of Hope's LWML group helped by sewing the blocks, laying out the quilt and working on the border. Marie herself cut each piece of cloth, prepared kits for others to sew the smaller blocks and completed the quilt with a **Rose of Sharon** boarder.

The central medallion called **The Tree of Life** was made by Marie Nelson.

Starting from the upper left-hand corner and moving clockwise, each block's name and meaning is as follows:

Star of the Magi: "Now after Jesus was born in Bethlehem of Judea in the days of Herod the king, behold, wise men from the east came to Jerusalem, saying, "Where is he who has been born king of the Jews? For we saw his star when it rose and have come to worship him.""
Matthew 2:1-2

Cross and Crown: "Do not fear what you are about to suffer. Behold, the devil is about to throw some of you into prison, that you may



be tested, and for ten days you will have tribulation. Be faithful unto death, and I will give you the crown of life." Revelation 2:10

Garden of Eden: "And the Lord God planted a garden in Eden, in the east, and there he put the man whom he had formed." Genesis 2:8

David and Goliath: "And there came out from the camp of the Philistines a champion named Goliath of Gath, whose height was six cubits and a span." "And David put his hand in his bag and took out a stone and slung it and struck the Philistine on his forehead. The stone sank into his forehead, and he fell on his face to the ground." 1Samuel 17:4, 49

Jacob's Ladder: "And he dreamed, and behold, there was a ladder set up on the earth, and the top of it reached to heaven. And behold, the angels of God were ascending and descending on it!" Genesis 28:12

Carpenter's Wheel: "and coming to his hometown he taught them in their synagogue, so that they were astonished, and said, "Where did this man get this wisdom and these mighty works? Is not this the carpenter's son? Is not his mother called Mary?..."

Devil's Claws: *"Be sober-minded; be watchful. Your adversary the devil prowls around like a roaring lion, seeking someone to devour.
