

Update – June 2022

The Chesapeake District LWML maintains a Special Gifts Endowment Fund for the purpose of receiving unrestricted gifts from individuals, groups or other sources. Special Gifts also funds small grants (up to \$300) for the mission and ministry of the Chesapeake District LWML, whether it be for small mission projects, special expenses or other programs.



Our most recent grant of \$200 was requested by the Lutheran Church of St. Andrew (Silver Spring, MD) to purchase books telling the stories of missionaries to the United States. These books will be donated to St. Paul's Lutheran School and Our Savior Lutheran School. The purpose is to expose young people to these stories so they can see how God has worked in the lives of ordinary men and women, who have become missionaries to the people of this country. This can inspire them to recognize that God is calling them to serve as proclaimers of the Good News of Jesus in their own communities. They are our modern-day missionaries.

Special Gifts is also a wonderful way to remember or honor someone and also support Chesapeake District LWML through your donations. Cards are sent to donors, the honorees, and the families of those memorialized to acknowledge the gifts. A Memory Book is kept, reflecting each donation received, and is displayed at our District Conventions. As of May 31, 2022, the Special Gifts Endowment Fund has a balance \$6,829.18 plus \$15,000 in a certificate of deposit.

All Grants Funded!



Your mites are hard at work. By the printing of this newsletter, we will have paid the final grants for the 2020-2022 Biennium! Praise God!

The 8th grant for was paid in May to Concordia Seminary St. Louis' Center for Hispanic Studies (CHS) and Ethnic Immigrant Institute of Theology (EIIT) ministerial formation program for a project called

"Making Jesus Known to U.S. Ethnic Communities." The theological education provided by CHS and EIIT enables dedicated immigrant/ethnic students to bring many people closer to Christ. These ethnic students and church workers live with considerably strained financial circumstances and do not have nearly the resources to fun their education costs. This grant will help to fund these students' education costs.

The 9th grant is for the Lutheran Church of Our Savior, Rehoboth Beach for \$5,000. They will share the love of Jesus with their community by hosting an English as a Second Language Program (ESL). The program supports and average of 150 students annually and provides child care services for the students for an average of 42 children with the help of 39 volunteers, a paid director and a paid childcare coordinator. The grant will help to replace outdated text books for the program.

Lutheran Bible Translators, our 10th and final grant for this biennium, is supported by Redeemer Lutheran Church LWML of Richmond, VA. This \$3000 will support translation of the Bible into Mbe, for the people of Ogoja area of Nigeria. The Mbe people are a farming community; they are industrious and hard-working. In 2012, translation work began on the Gospel of Luke. The people of MBE were not satisfied with only having the Gospel of Luke. They want more of God's Work in their language, so they can know God better. Bible translators will use this grant to further the translation of God's Word into Mbe.

Praise God for the work He does through the funding of these grants! Praise God for guiding the work of our LWML Mites!



Gifts of Love

Two years ago, Marie's husband was called home to Jesus. Bud had always taken care of the financial matters: paying bills, investing, and planning for the future. They had been married for seventy years. Now, Marie was feeling overwhelmed. The financial planner kept calling, asking her permission to change investment strate-gies. The life insurance company regularly had calling teams contacting her, asking if she wanted to add to her coverage. The local bank kept sending mail asking her if she wanted to refinance the mortgage. The senior living representative she and Bud had met four years ago kept asking if she was ready to move into assisted living. The burden of these decisions was overwhelming. So, when her daughter asked her if she had reviewed her will lately, Marie became angry. "I just need everyone to leave me alone. Stop bugging me."

It is wise to do good planning while both spouses are alive. It is even better to make sure that those plans are written down, detailing an organized, planned approach to caring for the financial gifts God has placed in your care. It is unwise to expect that children or other relatives will be able to jump in, without any prior involvement, to make the same kind of choices you have chosen all your life. They will lovingly do their part, but you may be asking them to carry out a difficult or impossible task. Planning can bring peace of mind. When a good plan is in place, seeking interaction with professional legal, financial or tax advisors can be seen as continuing that plan. Asking children to help will also be part of that continuance. Now is a good day to start. Your LWML Gift Planning Counselor can highlight areas of decision and point you to the right professionals to help you write down a plan, all the while expressing your love for your family and your devotion to the Lord.
